## Become a PastWalker by 'bagging' these plaques

Bagging is an old sporting term given new life by walkers and climbers in the Scottish Highlands who indulge in 'Munro Bagging' to claim each mountain ascent. This unique London village walk includes a list of plaques which can be 'bagged' by the intrepid walker. However, in order to keep this 'sport' under some sort of control we have set up some rules and guidance.

### Scoring

Old RSA or early LCC plaques	3 points each.
LCC or English Heritage Blue plaques	2 points each.
Local Authority plaques	2 points each.
Society and Friends plaques	1 point each.
Other plaques	1 point each.

Only plaques approved by [heritage.london](http://heritage.london) will count towards your score.

Proposals for inclusion in the listing are welcome but our decision is final.









Monuments are not normally included but there are some exceptions,

### Planning Your Walk

- If possible, walk with a friend

- Don't forget to take your camera with batteries fully charged

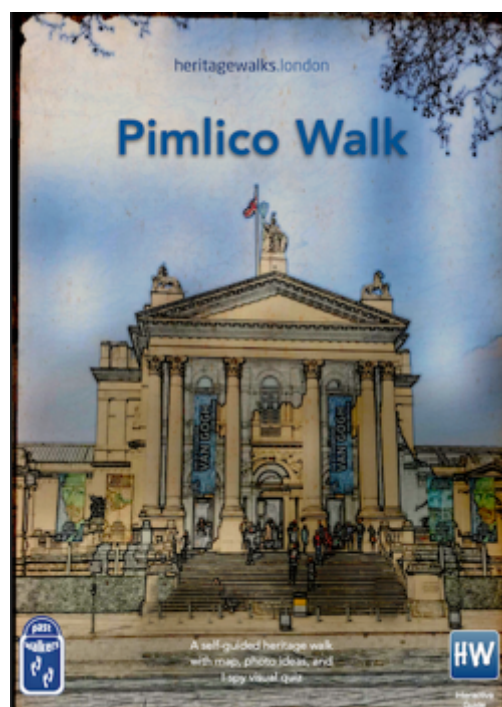
